Premium Rate Service (PRS) regulation in Iran(ongoing)

Premium Rate Service (PRS) is a service, a product or content that can be purchased by any mobile or fix phone subscriber via voice, SMS, MMS,... using the operator infrastructure, charging the tariff to the phone bill. Subscribers pay such charges through their regular monthly bill or through using pre-paid system, and whether the subscriber has a landline or a mobile phone.
